- Have knowledge and understanding of autism and how children and young people with autism learn
- Have the ability to use your knowledge of ASC strategies to adapt learning to meet the needs of all children and young people.
- Have an up to date understanding of the KS3/4 humanities National Curriculum and be able to adapt learning to meet the needs of children and young people in KS3/KS4 who are working towards GCSE and/or functional skills depending on ability and stage.
- Be able to use a wide range of communication tools to communicate with children and young people across the school.
- Be able to demonstrate a commitment to continuous improvement and innovation through imaginative and adaptive lessons which meet the needs of individual children and young people in line with their Education and health care plans.
- Possess the emotional and physical resilience necessary when working with children and young people with a range of complex needs.
- Have the ability to foster good relationships with other staff, children and young people, parents and the wider community.
- Have experience of enhancement of progress gains and raising attainment and achievement in all children and young people.

- Have experience of current assessment practice and the use of data and progress tracking to ensure that all groups of learners achieve.
- Be hardworking, organised and proactive in their professional development.
